Community arts project led by the Cheltenham Center for the Arts, which will produce participatory arts events in diverse Cheltenham neighborhoods and culminate in a community festival.

Community-engaged project in Cheltenham Township which connected residents with watershed ecology through community science and art making with natural materials.
